A Strawberry Smoothie for Spot?

Strawberries are typically in season in late spring/early summer, and are a great, healthy treat for dogs. If you have a blender, you can try these two “smoothie”-inspired dog treat recipes.

Doggy Dessert Chef’s appealing [Strawberry Banana Smoothie Biscuits](#) are a great seasonal treat for special occasions. (Plus, bananas are another healthy, safe fruit for dogs.) Cooking time is 15-20 minutes, and you’ll need a blender. (Note: these treats contains milk, so they are not suitable for lactose intolerant dogs.)

On the lighter side, there’s this [Frozen Strawberry Smoothie](#) recipe from Irresistible Pets. Strawberries and bananas are the only ingredients needed – simply combine them in a blender until smooth, pour the liquid into ice cube trays (heart-shaped ones are optional!), freeze for a few hours, and voila! Pair these treats with a smoothie of your own, and you’ve got a relaxing treat for the both of you to enjoy!

(GPS address is the firehouse next to the park- 34988 Eastin Dr, Union City 94587)



- If you have a scooter or cart to bring- please let us know.
- Bring a bike so someone can bike along with the group.
- MUST BRING A HELMUT to wear while scootering
- Two dogs per adult limit. (for control on scooters)

This event is to expose you and your dog to scootering and/or carting. We will be running 3 miles only of the trails available. We will have some drops set up to put your dog on safely while you learn and help others also experience this.

Directions: 880 North or south to 84 Dumbarton Bridge West. West on DeCoto Road, right onto Newark Blvd., right onto Ardenwood Blvd., left onto Eastin Dr. make an immediate left onto into Alameda Creek Regional Trail.
