SKYEWRITING

VALLEJO, Calif. (STNS) - In yet another stunning turn in an extraordinary career, Skye has declined an offer to join the Clinton administration and temporarily is leaving electoral politics introduce a Constitutional amendment to outlaw speciesism - and to concentrate on an unprecedented technology that will allow humans and dogs to communicate directly as well as over the Internet. The Siberian Husky disclosed the SIBE-HOWL computer project during a Thanksgiving-weekend press conference at which he confirmed rumors that President Clinton had asked him join the Cabinet as Secretary of Transportation. "I join Bob Dole and Ross Perot in congratulating Mr. Clinton, who faces tough sledding as he begins his second term," Skye said. "Americans have made their choice - at least those Americans who were allowed to choose." "But I believe I can better serve by continuing the battle to end speciesism so that all Americans will have a voice in their government," explained Skye, who in six short months has gone from Olympic champion to presidential candidate to high-tech entrepreneur. "We are preparing a Constitutional amendment for introduction in the new Congress that will outlaw speciesism in the same way that this country finally outlawed racial discrimination. Had we extended voting rights and full citizenship to all Americans, not just humans, in this just-concluded election, the results would have been dramatically different."

"Moreover, the revolutionary advances in computer technology that I am disclosing today will advance that cause by allowing direct, full and meaningful dialogue initially between humans and sled dogs; then with all canines and eventually with all species," Skye added "We have the technology. We can do it. Once communication has been established, cooperation will follow. We are entering a new era: the transition from cyberspace to syberspace."

The new technology is Synchronistic Interspecies Binary Extrapolation/Holistic Online World Link, or SIBE-HOWL, Skye explained.

"My good friend Matilda the Malemute and I were discussing during the campaign how difficult it was to

communicate even the most basic thoughts to humans because their language is limited to words," he explained. "We observed our human companions at their terminals, Matilda in Danville, Calif., and I in Vallejo, and decided to use computer technology to help them overcome their limitations."

"The principal is simple, based on advanced microchip technology," Skye explained. "A tiny chip, about half the size of the fingernail on your small finger and 100 times thinner, is implanted in the human body. The chip contains software capable of 'translating' sophisticated canine communications into the much more rudimentary human language. A minute fiber-optic cable is attached to a nerve ending, allowing almost-instantaneous processing of the signals. In less time than it takes to understand each other and with much more clarity, humans will be able to understand what we are saying and howl their responses. A larger version of the chip with advanced software that translates body language can be installed in computers, allowing humans with videoconferencing capabilities to communicate with Sibes over the Internet."

Skye and Matilda already have assembled an R&D engineering staff from fellow alumni of BASH Rescue & Referral. "The unexpected problem we had to solve was translating our sophisticated communications into the very format of human speech. The closest analog is that we communicate in a 33.6 multimedia environment while humans still are stuck on 2400 ASCII text. We really had to simplify the software to make it work."

SIBE-HOWL has been field-tested successfully, Skye disclosed. "We implanted a chip in Alan Doyle, my human companion," Skye said. "Before the conversion he was a typical human: he meant well but he just didn't get it. He has become remarkably responsive and much more responsible. There have been no side effects. The neighbors stopped complaining about his off-key howling once they learned it was a part of a test - and that he can't carry a tune in any language."

After further field testing during this winter's Iditarod race in Alaska in which Skye will lead a research team, SIBE-HOWL will be refined and should be on the market by April 1.

Along two years ago, when I had been into racing Siberians a couple of years, I was training my dogs up at our winter training ground, Weber Lake. I had never fallen off a sled before. I also had been mushing 3 pampered show dogs. Now I had 3 more Siberians that my husband had bought from Doug Willett in Utah. I had reasoned that these dogs would be more experienced. Little did I know that it would take a more experienced driver too. Of course, I was well seasoned, having come in a startling 45 minutes behind the last racer in my first 3 dog event, thereafter dead last. My talent knew no bounds.

And so, returning to my narrative, I was at Weber Lake, harnessing up my dogs, who were obviously enthusiastic, and enjoying every minute of the cool, crisp mountain air. My husband, Ken was all warnings. Men. They think women have no coordination or skill. They feel that if we fall we'll break. What he doesn't understand now, or did then, was that I am different. I am a creative clod, never getting hurt, always terrified. My life has past before my eyes so often that now it has been edited and produced by Warner Home Video.

Back to the rushing wind and shouting dogs. I yelled "hike" and we were off. I should say we launched. Prior to this, the dogs had been pulling a cart, which acts like a drag. The sled was 35 lbs. and we escaped the pull of gravity in seconds.

I must say I did well, studying my dogs gait, watching out for tangles in their lines, focused on their safety. And that is what I did. I noticed a snag in the lines between my point dogs(I was only running 6 2 lead, 2 point, 2 wheel) With a Herculean effort I managed to pause the sled long enough to pound the snow hook in the ground. This is when I realized that "Seppala" was not just a dog bred to sled, experienced and muscular, but a strong, and STUBBORN.

At this point I feel I should introduce Moose; out of the 3 dogs I bought from Doug, there was Genny, a female he felt would be a good leader. Luke, he felt would be an excellent wheeler with "great attitude". By the way Luke is also my most ethereally beautiful dog. Lastly there was No. Nine, that he threw in as "another good wheeler". My husband promptly named him Moose. I cannot fathom the creative mind that conjured up No. Nine, I can only guess that he was very drunk or on some cheap drugs.

Anyway, Moose is an enigma. His name benefits his personality. He is either pig-headed or as we mushers call it, moose-headed, or he is a cry-baby. He is also a dead ringer for a moose if you've had a lot of holiday cheer. My son says he is "buff"

To get on with my adventure - singing in the trees with all my dogs a sledding when I spy a tangle and hasten to straighten it out the dogs are now stopped. Luke and Genny have hesitated and Moose-Moose keeps pulling with his odd LOUD whine and pigeon toed jump, and pulling the snow hook right out. There I was stuck between my point dogs and my wheel dogs. We were stale mated for a few seconds while Moose tried to discover how to go through me; then I fell and the sled pranced over my broken body. I grabbed hold of the stanchion with a last weak reflex effort. And my dogs, as they ran down the trail were quite a sight. to behold, although the musher was horizontal, not vertical.

The quiet and serenity of mushing has always drawn me, gazing at the fresh green pines with their topping of snow and flashes of blue sky amid the branches.. Not I was able to either study the deep blue of a winter sky or as I tried to pull up, speculate as to how much snow (x distance to x speed) to my next facial.

I am proud to say that I lasted a mile, trying 3 separate times, using great Amazonian strength and gifts of cunning to pull my way up the sled. But Moose outwitted me all the time. The dogs listened to Moose. And that's when I gave up the ghost, so to speak. In my spirit, Moose leads.

In my dreams of this incident, I can hear my singing, frantic calls: Moose, whoa! Moose STOP Moose PLEASE STOP!

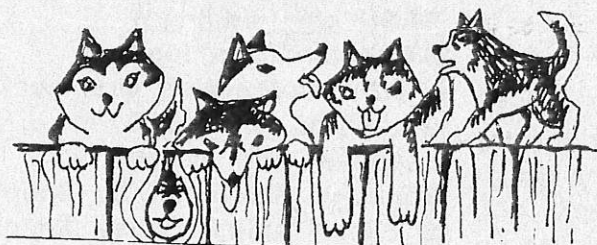
BASHR/R story of the month

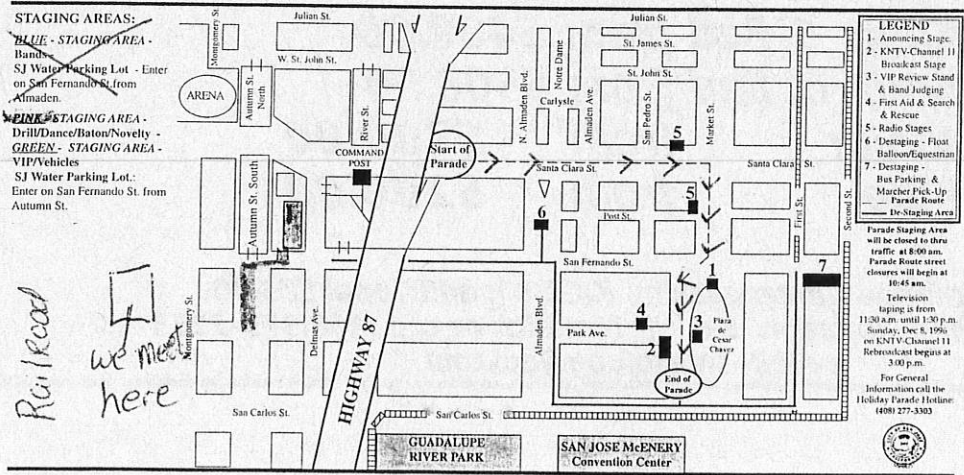

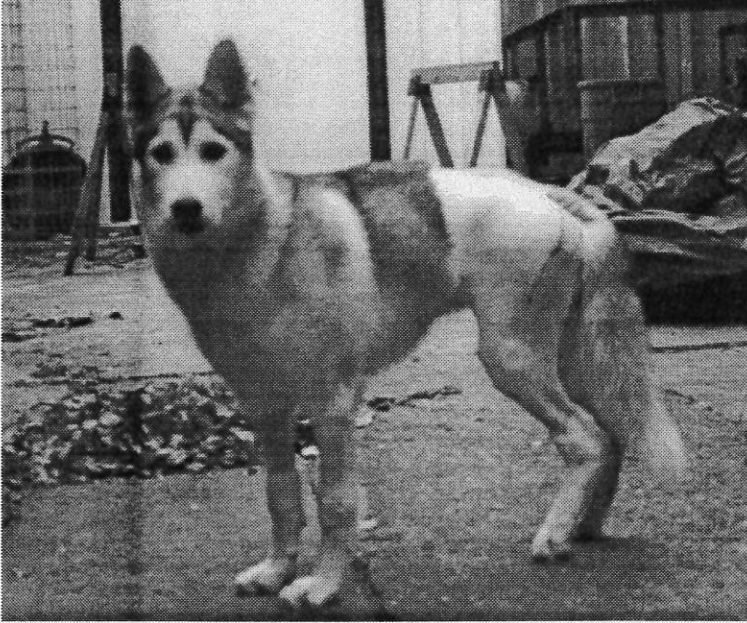

Many of you have heard, some have not but Grace escaped her yard on October 30. She was hit by a car. Fortunately she was hit blocks from her vet. A bicyclist ran to the vets to get them for this "puppy" and they found it was Grace. She was in sad shape. One lung was collapsed, her jaw was broken, numerous cuts and abrasions along with a broken pelvis. The first thing was to get to to live through the night! She did with



many prayers from all. She made it through day 2 and things started looking up. She was eating, recognizing her owner, Kathy, and becoming agitated at being there. After three days her lungs cleared without any damage! She was able to go home.

Once she had gotten over that, put on a pound or two she went back for xrays to see about her other injuries. Until that time they would not treat the "superficial" things. The jaw would heal without any problems but the pelvis would not. A specialist was brought in. They put a plate and numerous screws in to piece her hip socket back together. They also finally sewed up a few of her cuts.

Within days Grace was figuring out how to escape the bedroom, run down a flight of stairs (it took her a few days before she would come up) and just plain terrorize Kathy along with her playmates Konan and Stoli. She also helped the vet by removing most of her stitches prior to her appointment.

She now has some fuzz on the hip, you would never know anything had happened to her jaw, and she is just her usual sweet self.
