## Peanut Butter and Yogurt Dog Treat Hearts



In honor of Valentine's Day and our favorite four-legged family member, we pulled out the [heart-shaped ice tray](#) again this year to whip up some super simple and natural frozen treats. Peanut butter and Greek yogurt are some of Basil's favorite goodies, so we came up with this fun twist on the [frosty paws recipe](#) we like to make for him. What's great about these treats is how simple they are to make and store. They require minimal and completely natural ingredients, can be made in large batches to store in a freezer bag

You'll need plain organic Greek yogurt, natural peanut butter, a heart shaped ice tray (really any ice tray will do, we got ours from Ikea) and a spoon

Spoon a small amount of peanut butter into the base of the ice tray. You can heat up the peanut butter first to make it easier (and not so messy) to spoon in. The more you add, the thicker the top layer on the treats will appear. Next up, dollop heaping spoonfuls of the yogurt to cover the peanut butter in each mold:

Press yogurt down into the molds using the back of your spoon to make sure they're packed. This will help seal the peanut butter and yogurt together in the final treat. You can even gently "drop" the tray a few times in order to encourage further settling. If you have excess yogurt in any of the molds, gently scoop away until level with mold and pop into the freezer for at least 4 hours:

Once frozen, remove tray and pop out individual frozen treats — voila!

# Iron Paws Stage Race

A group of BASH members entered the Iron Paws Stage Race in December. The Stage Race is a six week event running from January 1st to February 10 this year. The race is in it's ninth year. It is a race based on accumulated points earned through mileage, socials, and fun activities. The main purpose of the race is to spend time with your dogs and your friends. "Running with a Friend" is the largest weekly bonus point category. The friend you run with does not have to have an Iron Paws team, making it super easy to earn extra points. The race has many divisions, even a walk with your dog in the Recreational Canicross class.

Most of our group signed up as a 2 Dog Dryland teams having our dogs pull scooters and bicycles. We also have Recreational Canicross teams. Eight of the twelve California teams are in the Bay Area so all of the social events are located here. We have been meeting up every week for a fun run. We also had our Regional Run on January 20th.

The Regional Run was very successful, with all eight Bay Area teams attending, plus two teams that came just to join in the fun. We started at Shady Oaks Park and ran along Coyote Creek Trail. Most of us ran four to five miles, with one team covering a little over eleven miles. After the run, Mark Scrivener taught a mushing clinic. Six people and their dogs came to learn how to scooter and both our Canicross teams tried out scooters. Our group is planning on teaching another clinic in March, so watch the newsletter for information!

California teams are doing very well! Our high scorer is Richard Jackson: Team Dream Catchers. Dream Catchers is in second place of a field of fifty-two— 2 Dog Dryland with 235.4 points. Sayli Benadikar, team Mush Love, is in third place of a field of forty-five in Recreational Canicross at 117.5 points!

Iron Paws has been a fun way for all of us to get out with our dogs in winter weather that, in Northern California, can sometimes be cold and wet. The fun activities had us competing for popcorn tosses with our dogs, and the socials have become great informal "how to" classes for new and experienced owners alike. People unable to scoot or run can join us at the socials post run or friends can join their buddies doing Canicross walking too!
