


The Staff had requested that we come and talk about the Siberians as a breed and pet. We showed the kids how we harness and bootie the dogs. Discussed their coats, there personalities

and how we exercise and entertain them. The dogs and the kids had a blast.



Ingredients:

Wine Bottle Cookie Cutter

1 C peanut butter
1 C skim milk
1 TBSP baking powder

2 C [wheat flour](#)

Icing Ingredients:

4 ounces of cream cheese, room temp
2 TBSP vegetable oil
1 tsp vanilla
1/2 tsp honey

Directions:

- Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- Add the peanut butter to the milk.
- Whisk together the baking powder and flour in a bowl.
- Gradually add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients.
- Mix all ingredients together until well blended.
- Cover the counter top with parchment paper.
- Sprinkle some wheat flour on the parchment paper lined counter top.
- Roll out the dough out onto the lined counter top.
- With the cookie cutters cut out dog treats.
- Put the cookies on the lined baking sheet.
- Bake at 375 degrees for 15-20 minutes.
- Allow to cool on the baking sheet for about 10 minutes.
- Transfer to a wire rack for cool.



Peanut Butter Coconut Oil Dog Treats

Ingredients

- 1 cup all-natural peanut butter
- 1 teaspoon unprocessed coconut oil
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- silicon paw print tray

1. Be sure the coconut oil is in liquid form. If not, place coconut oil in a small saucepan over medium-low heat and cook until melted.
2. Add peanut butter and cinnamon. Stir until mixture is completely smooth and thoroughly mixed. Mixture should be thick, but pourable.
3. Pour mixture into tray and freeze until set.
4. Carefully remove from tray and store in air-tight container in freezer (they soften quickly).



Notes


These were made for dogs in the 10-15 pound range. Adjust the amount coconut oil accordingly. Rule of thumb is that you use 1 teaspoon of coconut oil per 10 pounds of your dog's body weight.

I'm fairly certain they'll be 'begging' for more! Looking for more dog treats to share with your fur babies? If so, these recipes might interest you.
