How can you protect your pet from the stress associated with fireworks?

- Keep your pets indoors.
- Close the curtains or blinds and turn on the TV or radio to provide some distraction.
- Provide treat toys, such as KONG's filled with their favorite food, to help keep their minds busy and distract them from the fireworks.
- Provide a quiet place, such as a carrier or crate, which may give your pet a sense of security and comfort.
- Use a leash or carrier if you must go outside with your pet to keep them from running off which is a common response to stress and fear.
- Practice fire safety! Keep pets away from matches, open fires, and fireworks. Pets may try to sniff (or eat) fireworks and pet hair can easily catch fire if they get too close.
- Take pets for a walk before the fireworks begin. Some pets are too

frightened to go out once the fireworks are popping, and this may lead to an "accident" later on.

- Make sure your pet's ID/Microchip is current. Your pets should always have proper identification tags with current information in case they get lost.

Humans may enjoy the revelry of fireworks, but for some pets – fireworks, like thunder storms, can cause a great deal of stress which may include:

- Violent shaking, trembling
- Excessive drooling
- Barking, howling
- Trying to hide or get into / out of the house, fence, or other enclosure
- Refusing to eat food
- Some animals may loose bladder or bowel control or experience temporary diarrhea from prolonged stress

FIREWORKS PET SAFETY TIPS

★ KEEP PETS INDOORS
Don't bring your pets outside during the fireworks! Loud pops and booms could easily startle your pet and cause them to run away.

★ PROVIDE A QUIET PLACE
Prepare a place for your pet such as a quiet room, pet carrier, or crate to help them feel secure.

★ GIVE THEM DISTRACTIONS: TOYS, TREATS, SOOTHING MUSIC
Treat toys such as kongs filled with their favorite food may help keep their minds busy and distract them from the fireworks.

★ MICROCHIP & ID YOUR PETS
Your pets should always have proper identification tags, with up-to-date contact information. Microchipping is also strongly recommended and make sure that information is up-to-date too!

★ WALK YOUR DOG EARLIER IN THE DAY
Some pets may be too frightened to go out once the fireworks are popping and this will be a good way to tire them out so that they can rest better later.

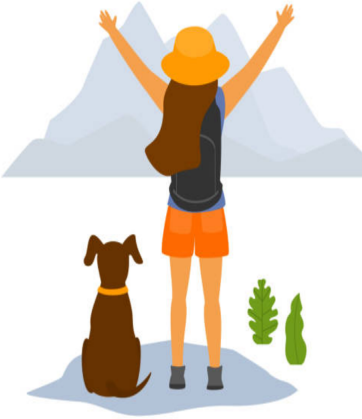

Driving Directions to Half Moon Bay SB

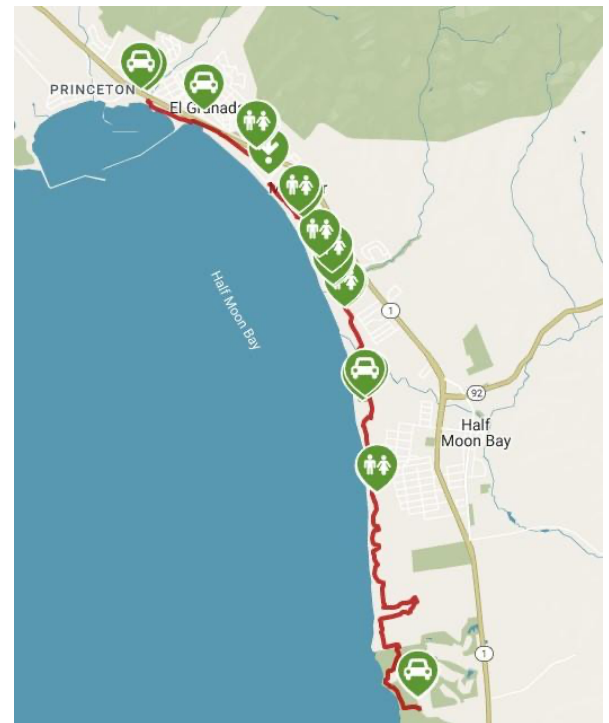
The beach is located a half-mile west of Highway 1 with 3 parking lots in the City of Half Moon Bay. The three parking and beach access points are below:

Francis Beach, at the end of Kelly Avenue in the City of Half Moon Bay. – This is the on to meet at

Venice Beach, at the end of Venice Boulevard off Highway 1.

Dunes Beach, at the end of Young Avenue off Highway 1.

Francis Beach, the main hub of Half Moon Bay State Beach, is located at 95 Kelly Avenue. The beach is easily accessible with a paved ramp leading down the sand. The day-use area features a large picnic area with barbecues and restrooms with running water.

Emburr got 3 Best in shows so far this month She is currently #1 siberian in the nation.

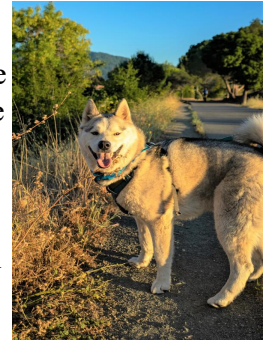

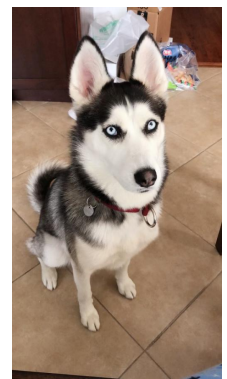

Fourth of July Pup-Friendly Hot Dog Minis



Ingredients

[Blue Dog Bakery Beef Deli Sticks](#)

[Kong Stuff n Easy Treat Bacon & Cheese Recipe](#)

2 teaspoons powdered Parmesan cheese

3/4 cup of flour

1/4 cup of water

2 tablespoons natural peanut butter (*make sure it does not contain xylitol, which is toxic to dogs*)

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
2. Mix 1/2 cup of flour and all of Parmesan cheese together in a bowl
3. Add in peanut butter and water
4. Mix with spoon until the mixture thickens. Once it becomes too thick to mix, massage the mixture with your hands until a consistent dough forms
5. Sprinkle the remaining 1/4 cup of flour onto your workstation
6. Roll the dough until it makes a long, cylindrical shape about 1 inch thick
7. Cut the dough into 3-inch pieces
8. Take one of your 3-inch pieces and make a crease down the middle lengthwise (so it forms a hot dog bun shape)
9. Repeat for the other five dough pieces
10. Place the "buns" on a non-stick sheet pan
11. Put the treats in the oven for 7-10 minutes, or until hard
12. While your treats are cooking, tear the Blue Dog link treats into 3-inch pieces
13. Once the treats have cooled off (about 10 minutes out of the oven), place the cut links into each "bun"
14. Spray the KONG treat in a squiggly line on top of each link
15. Given to your pup to enjoy!
