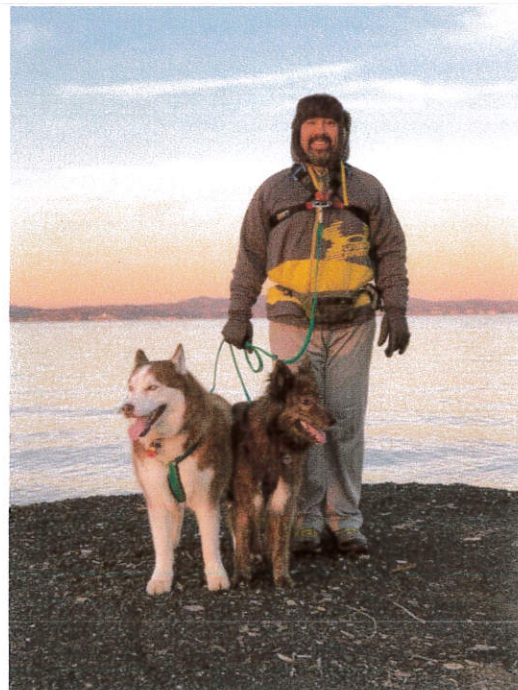

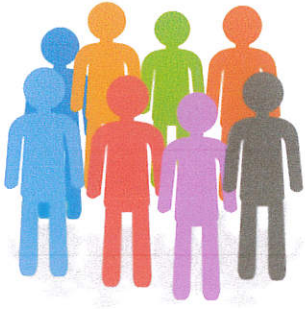

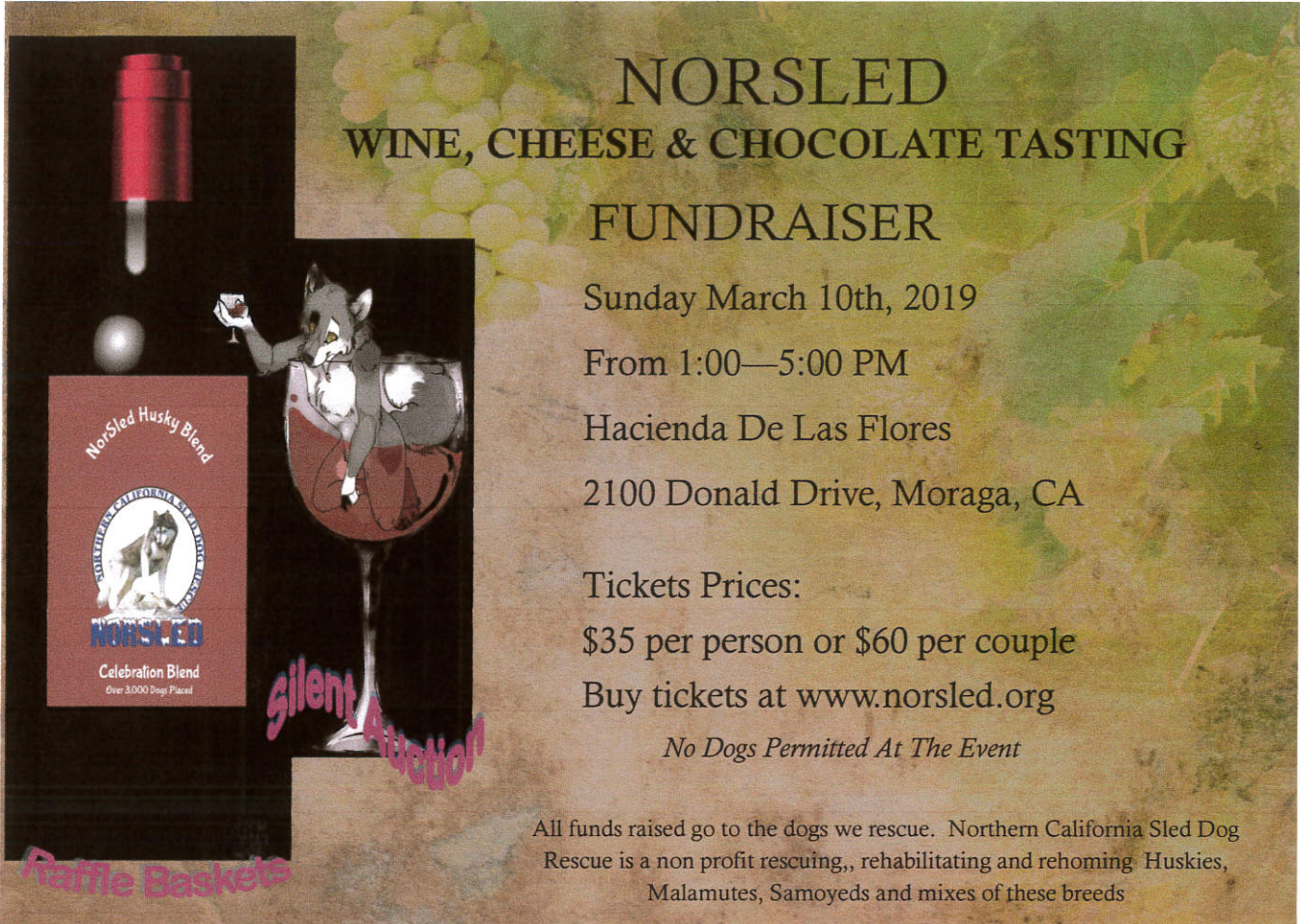

Doggie Green Bean Crunchies

Ingredients

- 16 ounces frozen, cut green beans (about 5 cups), thawed and any excess water drained (without salt)
- 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 170 degrees.
2. Add green beans and oil to a mixing bowl and toss to coat beans. Evenly spread green beans on a large, parchment lined or non-stick, baking sheet. Dry beans in the oven for 8 hours or until all beans are crunchy. Turn off the oven and allow to cool completely before storing in an airtight container.
3. Optional Dehydrator Instructions: Dry at 170 degrees for 8 hours or until crunchy.
4. *I usually dry my green beans in the oven overnight.

Husky Hike! Sunday morning March 10th 9 AM

Don Edwards Wildlife Preserve Refuge Headquarters Visitor Center Parking Lot
Newark near Fremont

From Freeway 880, take the Thornton Avenue and head west toward the bay. From Highway 84 (at the east end of the Dumbarton Bridge), exit at Thornton Avenue. Travel south on Thornton Avenue for 0.8 miles to the Refuge entrance on the right, at Marshlands Road. Turn right into the Refuge and follow signs to the parking lot. The Visitor Center is located by the first parking lot to your right.

About 9:15 we will head out south along Marshlands Road and cross the footbridge over 84 to Coyote Hills Park. We will hike approximately 5 miles through the park.

Dogs must be on a 6 foot leash and may only travel trails marked for dogs. Bathrooms and dog water available at the north end of the parking lot. Due to the salt air, our dogs always seemed to get thirsty half way through the walk, so bring water along for your dogs. We will pass by a couple water fountains and restrooms in the park. Dress for cold or windy conditions, sunscreen, comfortable shoes.

This is my favorite walk in Fremont -- the expansive vistas and salt air, the varied terrain, and well maintained trails are a pleasure. I always leave here with refreshed and elevated spirits.

The Fun Run is for anyone who has experience scootering or would like to walk or run with their dogs. We will head toward Hellyer Park around the lake and back. This is around 4 miles.

The Mushing Clinic is an Intro to Mushing Mini Clinic for anyone who would like to teach their dog to pull. Or give their already pulling dog a job! During the clinic we will teach you the basic commands and how to train your dog with a drag weight. And then for those who feel ready to do so, to try out a scooter.

Please bring a X-back or Canicross harness, two six foot leashes, and a Alaskan Limited Slip collar if you have these items. We will have harnesses and a few leashes to borrow and Collars for sale (\$5.00). Absolutely zero choke chains or pinch collars will be allowed! Yummy dog treats and lots of loving praise are allowed! And for you humans please bring a bicycle helmet and I also recommend gloves.

Please do not let your dogs socialize when you get there. They need to understand that when the harness go on that it is work time not play time.

This event is also a great opportunity to brush up on yours and your dog's Mushing skills just in case we are able to have a SnoBash this year.
