homemade mint dog treats recipe. As are all my recipes, this one is easy to make and uses simple ingredients. Keep your dog's breath minty fresh by treating them to this delectable homemade creation.

Homemade Mint Dog Treats Recipe

Recipe makes about four dozen small treats. What you'll need:

- 4 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 cup water
- 1 tbsp coconut oil (for added health benefits)
- 1 egg
- 1 cup fresh mint
- 1/2 cup fresh parsley
- <u>Dog bone shaped cookie cutters</u>

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 350°.
- Start by whisking the egg, water and coconut oil in a large bowl until it becomes a smooth mixture.
- Slowly pour the 4 cups of flour into the liquid mixture until it creates a workable dough.
- Knead in the parsley and mint. (You could also add it to the flour before you pour it into the liquid mixture, but I chose to knead it in). If you find that your dough is too dry, add some water 1/4 cup at a time. If your dough is too sticky, add more flour as necessary.
- Sprinkle some flour on your kitchen counter top or work space. Roll out the dough.
- Cut the dough into shapes using the <u>dog bone shaped cookie cutters</u>.
- Lay the treats on a baking sheet.
- Bake for 15 minutes, or longer if you want a harder treat.
- Let the treats completely cool before giving them to your dog. Refrigerate for up to a week to preserve freshness.

- 1. Understand your role in pet first aid.
- 2. Learn how to triage your pet and check their vital signs.

- 4. Identify the steps and actions needed to administer CPR correctly.
 - 5. Know the conditions for stopping CPR.

Hotels inside park boundaries don't allow pets, <u>but pet-friendly places to curl up</u> (click on lodging type and use the pet-friendly filter) are abundant elsewhere in Mariposa County. In Yosemite Valley, the premier winter/spring waterfall hike leads to <u>Lower Yosemite Fall</u>, the most accessible of three stair-stepped cascades that comprise America's tallest cataract at 2,425 feet in total height. <u>Read more...</u>

Rules

*Pucks and Paws FAQ at the bottom of the page

- All dogs must be on leash at all times.
- All dogs must be 6 months or older in order to attend.
- All dogs must also have a ticket.
- All dogs must satisfy current vaccination requirements (see below).
- All dogs must wear an identification tag to the game and be accompanied by someone 18 years or older.
- Fans must bring signed waiver for each guest in your party (minors included).
- If you are purchasing tickets for attendees other than yourself, they will also need to sign a waiver upon check-in. Please make sure each person in your group fills out a waiver prior to arrival.
- All dogs must be well-behaved. Dogs showing any signs of aggression will be asked to leave without refund.

Vaccination Requirements

All dogs must be in good health and have current Rabies, Distemper, Adenovirus 2 or Hepatitis, Parvo virus, Parainfluenza, and Kennel Cough (Bordatella) vaccinations.

Download, print, and complete your waivers ahead of time to expedite your check-in process. Waivers must be completed for everyone in the party, including minors.
