Yield: About 3 dozen small cookies

4 eggs, divided (2 for the dough, 2 for the wash)

1 ounce vegetable oil

1 tablespoon honey

8 ounces chicken stock

10 ounces whole wheat flour

5 ounces all purpose flour

3 ounces cornmeal

1 cup peanut butter

1. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees. In a large bowl, whisk together two of the eggs, the oil and honey. Whisk in the chicken stock.

2. In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, combine the whole wheat flour, AP flour and cornmeal. With the mixer on medium speed, slowly pour in the chicken stock mixture, *then add the peanut butter*. Mix until the dough comes together, about 1 minute.

3. Divide the dough in half. Roll out each ball of dough approximately ½ inch thick. Cut into desired shapes using small (3 to 4-inch) cookie cutters. Place on baking sheets sprayed with cooking oil.

4. Whisk the remaining two eggs and brush the egg wash lightly over the cookies. Allow to dry for 10 minutes and brush with the egg wash a second time (the second wash is optional, but gives the cookies a darker brown color). Bake until golden brown, about 15 minutes,

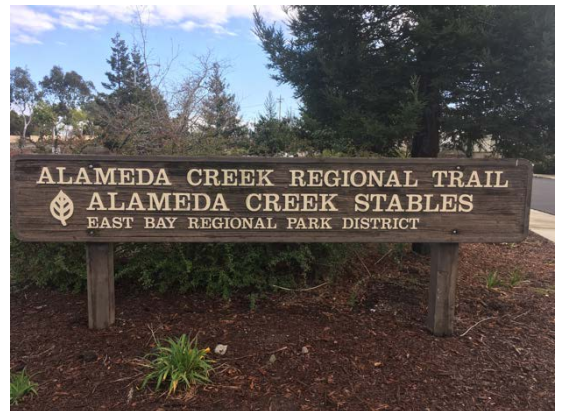

Fortini Trail Hike April 28th

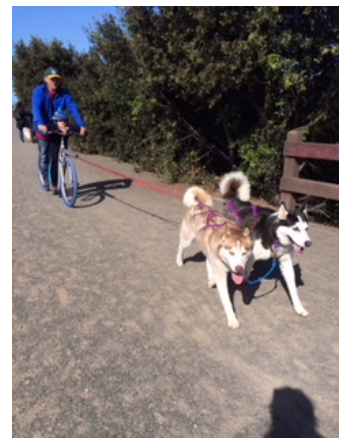

At just over a year old Zander is young and active. He would do well with an active home that likes to spend time with their dog(s). He has a great personality. He rides well in the car and walks fairly well on leash. He easily learned sit and down and is very sweet and wants to please. We took him on a club hike and he was great. He was great with all the little kids even though they wanted to sit on him. He is a dog that needs attention and exercise and a secure yard with high fencing for when he is outside. He is very happy to hang out in the house with the family and enjoys being pet and attention. He is on the larger side for a Siberian (he may have some Malamute in him) and will need a home with people who understand Northern breeds and are willing to give him the time, attention and exercise he needs. He does have a prey drive so he will NOT be placed in a home with cats, small dogs or other small animals. Larger dogs are fine.
